

- Unready, unable to sight-read the notes nor counting, nor blending, they tighten their throats. The descant so piercing is soaring above the melody only a mother could love.
- They have a director, but no one knows why.
 No one in the choir deigns turn him (her) an eye.
 It's clear by his waving, he wants them to look,
 but each of them stands with his nose in the book.
- Despite the offenses, the music rings out. The folks in the pews are enraptured, no doubt. Their faces are blissful, their thoughts are so deep, but it is no wonder, for they are asleep.
