We would be remiss if we did not lift up the dedicated service of Ruth Bowers. Ruth has decided to retire as Editor of this publication, the *Fundamental Tone*, the major means of outreach to our membership. You may have noticed that the editorial staff of *Fundamental Tone* grew from one to two a couple of year ago when Bill Noss, a graphic designer, began helping Ruth with the layout for the publication. It was a perfect match, and Ruth's mentoring proved so effective she felt she could now retire, knowing that the publication she loved and nurtured for more than 15 years would be in very good hands.

At the May Board Meeting, we participated in a "visioning session" which resulted in the development of a draft Mission Statement that we plan on using in our decision making process. That statement lifts up the great diversity of handbells and our call to promote musical excellence in handbells through performing, organizing, educating and mentoring. Ruth was an active part of that "visioning" and she exemplifies each aspect of that call, and has for over 22 years. Ruth was the Area Historian for a period of time in 1985; she became Massachusetts State Chair, in 1986 and held that position until 1989 when she became Chair Elect. Ruth served as Chair from 1991–1993, and Past Chair from '93–'95. According to the records located, Ruth became Editor of *Fundamental Tone* in 1995, a position she held until announcing her retirement officially at the Biennial Meeting on June 30, 2007.

Ruth has exemplified those qualities identified as vital to Area I's mission throughout her tenure of service. Ruth has been a dedicated director, ringer, and teacher. She has kept us organized through her work as Editor of *Fundamental Tone*, no small task since members of the Board seem to have difficulty with deadlines. Above all else, Ruth has been a willing and skilled mentor. Those who have rung under her direction speak of her nurturing, caring style, Board members speak of her skill in supporting and mentoring them, and she enthusiastically embraced the opportunity to share editorial responsibilities with Bill Noss in order to prepare him to assume responsibility for the *Fundamental Tone* when she was ready to step down.
