After each rehearsal, use these cloths to clean your bells. Inner red cloth has jeweler's rouge embedded in the cloth for cleaning. The outer buffing cloth wipes away the rouge and light tarnish.

Polishing Cloth \$3.00 Polishing cloths may cause staining of gloves or covers. Use with caution.

Cleaning Cloths

Use one cloth to apply the polish to the bell casting. Remove the polish with a second cloth. A third cloth picks up any remaining residue. The lint-free interlocking knit does not unravel. Cloths may be washed and reused, but each washing reduces absorbency.

- 2) Download the **Group Registration Form,** enter your contact information, housing and course selections (if



REPORT FROM CONNECTICUT

The **Connecticut Spring Ring** will be held on Saturday, April 27 at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in Bristol. Registration material will be emailed to those whose e-addresses we have. If you have not received a heads-up about this in January already, please contact me to update your address or to request a snail mail mailing.

The Spring Ring will follow the usual format: three workshops slots during the day; morning and afternoon massed ring rehearsals with final performance mid-afternoon; and a break for lunch. Participants will need to bring their own lunches, but "coffee and" with snacks will be available for those who arrive early! The workshops are not finalized as of this writing, but we are looking at responses from past years and suggestions for this year. The cost will be \$12 per participant, and we will adapt the online registration process established for the Area 1 fall workshops.

As always, we are looking for loaner equipment (bells, chimes, tables and foam) to use in the workshops. We also have space for vendors and displays.

Rick Wood will be our clinician/director for the Massed Ring. He has selected three pieces:

1) *Thee We Adore, O Hidden Savior* by Cathy Moklebust – Level 1+, 2–3 Oct or 3–5 Oct

This is a great piece for "Watch the Director." Because the piece is based on a chant, there

can be a lot of fluidity in the tempo, and it's easy enough to look up frequently. It shows Cathy's innate sensitivity to simplicity.

- 2) Fantasy on Terra Beata by H. Dean Wagner Level 2+, 3–7 Oct with Flute (Churches could use flute stop on organ if no flute player is available.) This is a great springtime piece with a touch of Native American flavor to it. Beautiful big rolling chords.
- 3) **Song of Gladness** by Arnold Sherman Level 2+. 2–6 Oct. This piece is also one of the selections for the Massed Ring at Festival in June. It is a bright, energetic piece for festivals or church celebrations.

The MA Spring Ring is a great opportunity for individual ringers to brush up on their skills, or for a group to get the feel of participating in a massed ring, whether or not you will be attending Festival in June.

As with any event sponsored by the Handbell Musicians of America, participants are required to be members of the Guild. Individual ringers are covered by the blanket membership of their director, whether or not they come as a group. If your whole ensemble is not able to come, individual ringers may be placed as "orphans" with another group for that day; or your group can adopt an orphan or two, if possible. Please let me know if you belong to either category.

INSTRUCTIONS for CHOIR APPLICATION:

Handbell Musicians of America Area 1 established the Elizabeth Bradford Endowment Fund to provide scholarship assistance to encourage choirs to attend their first Area 1 Festival/Conference. In non-Festival years we also grant scholarships to directors to encourage them to attend their first national educational event. We hope that attending these types of events helps ringers and directors to develop their handbell skills and helps them to become more active in The Guild. Only the income from the endowment is used for scholarships, but this is usually enough to provide partial registration assistance for several choirs/directors to attend F/C.

Choir Scholarships for Handbell Musicians of America Area 1 Festival/Conference are available to Area 1 handbell choirs who are attending their first Area 1 Festival/Conference. *Please be aware that the scholarship awarded will only pay a portion of the registration fee for Festival.*

- 1. A choir will be defined as a performing group of 7 or more ringers.
- 2. Preference will be given to those *choirs having at least 75% of their members planning to attend* the Festival/Conference.
- 3. Prior attendance by a director or a single member of a choir will not preclude eligibility for this scholarship.
- 4. The choir must be a member in good standing in Area 1.
- 5. You must *fill out a registration form for Festival in its entirety and pay a \$100 deposit per person* prior to the Festival's early bird deadline.

Applications for scholarship should be sent to the address indicated below. Your Festival registration should still be sent to the Festival registrar. You must fill out the entire Festival registration form prior to the Early Bird deadline for all ringers who plan on attending, indicating on the form that you are applying for a scholarship and sending in a deposit of \$100 per person instead of the entire registration fee. After you have been notified about our scholarship decision you will be expected to pay any remaining balance of your registration fees.

Awards will be distributed on a per ringer basis. For example, if you receive an award of \$100 per person and you have 10 people attending, then you will receive \$1,000 off your total registration fee. If any of your ringers withdraws their registration, your total scholarship will be reduced by the amount for one ringer unless another ringer takes their place.
